Supersonic Spelling Stars



Adding the suffix /cian/ to the root word to change verbs to nouns sounds like /shun/ but spelt /cian/.



In most words the root word ends in /c/ or /cs/. Spell the word, remove the /c/ or /cs/ and simply add /cian/.

When a word describes an occupation, it is usually spelt /cian/.

Your child is currently exploring the suffix /cian/ in their spellings. It is important that you child understands the meaning of the word by becoming a "word whizz", is able to put it into a sentence (that makes sense) and be able to both read and spell the word accurately.

Adding the suffix /sion/ to the root word to change verbs to nouns sounds like /shun/ or /zhn/ but we spell it /sion/



if the root word ends in /d/ or /se/ , spell the word, remove the /d/ or /se/ and simply odd /sion/. Adding /sion/ to words with no root word, simply spell the word and choose to use /sion/. Remember it sounds like /shun/. If the ending of the word sounds like /zhn/, it is also spelt as /sion/.
