Words ending in /able/

If the root word can be heard, simply spell the root word and add /able/. If the root word ends in /e/ simply remove the /e/ and add /able/. Except for /ce/ and /ge/ word endings - keep the /e/.
If the root word ends in /y/, change the /y/ to an /i/ and add /able/. If there is no root word, simply spell the word and add /able/.

Your child is currently exploring the suffix /able/ in their spellings. It is important that you child understands the meaning of the word by becoming a "word whizz", is able to put it into a sentence (that makes sense) and be able to both read and spell the word accurately.
