Adding the suffix /ssion/ to the root word to change verbs to nouns sounds like /shun/ but we spell it /ssion/.



If the root word ends in <code>/ss/</code>, spell the word, and simply add on <code>/ion/</code> to make the <code>/shun/</code> sound spelt <code>/ssion/</code>. If the root word ends in <code>/mit/</code>, spell the word, and simply remove the <code>/t/</code> and add <code>/ssion/</code> to make the <code>/shun/</code> sound. When there is no root word, simply spell the word and choose to use <code>/ssion/</code> at the end.

Your child is currently exploring the suffix /ssion/ in their spellings. It is important that you child understands the meaning of the word by becoming a "word whizz", is able to put it into a sentence (that makes sense) and be able to both read and spell the word accurately.

Adding the suffix /ation/ to the root word to change verbs to nouns. It sounds like /ashun/ but we spell it /ation/.



Spell the root word and add /ation/.

If the root word ends in /y/ change the /y/ to an /i/ and add /ation/. In some words you may need to add /c/ before /ation/.

If the root word ends in /e/, remove the /e/ and add /ation/.

If the root word ends in /ate/, spell the word, remove the /ate/ and simply add /ation/.
