# SUPERSONIC Spelling Stars

Words containing the /ei/ spelling for the sound /ee/.

Use the /ei/ spelling where the sound is pronounced /ee/. "i before e except after c" will work for some of the words but not for others that don't follow that rule.

Your child is currently exploring the letter string /ei/ in their spellings. It is important that you child understands the meaning of the word by becoming a "word whizz", is able to put it into a sentence (that makes sense) and be able to both read and spell the word accurately.







