



One sunny, day, one sunny day.</p> <p><b>Alliteration:</b> is the repetition of the first letter of a word: e.g. The lonely lazy lion, Big brown bears.</p> <p><b>Onomatopoeia:</b> words that look and sound like the sound their describing e.g. drip, woosh, zap, bang, hiss, buzz.</p> <p><b>Simile:</b> A simile is a way of describing something by saying it is like something else. Similes often use the words: like and as. He is strong like a superhero.</p> </div>


