


<p>Literacy</p> <p>Comprehension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To engage with books and other reading materials at an increasingly deeper level, sometimes drawing on their phonic knowledge to decode words, and their knowledge of language structure, subject knowledge and illustrations to interpret the text. <p>Word reading</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To begin to link sounds to some frequently used digraphs, e.g. sh, th, ee. To begin to read some high frequency words, and to use developing knowledge of letters and sounds to read simple phonically decodable words and simple sentences. <p>Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To use their developing phonic knowledge to write things such as labels and captions and simple sentences. To form lower case and capital letters correctly. To use a capital letter and full stop. To re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense. <p>GPAS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To count the words in a sentence. To expand use of known verbs during PE and other play activities. 	<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>Listening, attention and understanding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To indicate two-channelled attention, e.g. paying attention to something of interest for short or long periods; can both listen and do for short span. To understand questions such as who; why; when; where and how. To ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them. To engage in non-fiction books.
